Los Angeles, CA - **Art Los Angeles Contemporary (ALAC)** will return to Hollywood. The international art fair's 11th edition (February 13-16, 2020) will be held for the first time at the historic **Hollywood Athletic Club** on Sunset Boulevard, where fifty exhibitors from around the world will provide a dynamic and informed cross-section of international, contemporary art.

ALAC 2020 will present a robust selection of exhibitors from Los Angeles, as well as San Francisco, Portland, New York and Chicago in addition to international exhibitors from around the world, including Australia, Belgium, Germany, Hong Kong, Japan, Luxembourg, New Zealand, Peru, Poland, Sweden, and the UK. Long-term & returning participants, include **1301PE, Luis De Jesus Los Angeles, Praz-Delavallade, STARKWHITE, The Hole and Marinaro**, as well as **Pola Magnetyczne, Galerie Parisa Kind, Clages, Situations, Mrs, and Et al.**

*"ALAC has been building connections to our city and its collectors and putting content and galleries first for 11 years." ALAC founder and director **Tim Fleming** commented, "We're moving to the Hollywood Athletic Club with the same philosophy we've always had, partnering with a core group of long-term international and Los Angeles-based exhibitors,*

and welcoming galleries that joined us for the first-time last year. This marriage and commitment to LA marks our future – it's what a fair in this city needs to be.”

A meeting place for celebrities and locals alike, the **Hollywood Athletic Club** was founded by Charlie Chaplin in 1924 and frequented by Joan Crawford, John Ford, Jean Harlow, Howard Hughes, Groucho Marx, Mae West, and more. ALAC 2020 will span the Club's two floors, inhabiting both its vaulted ceiling ballroom and its athletic infrastructure, including a gymnasium and racquetball courts. Re-envisioning the original 1920s architecture will be Mexico-City based architectural studio **PRODUCTORA** in collaboration with Los Angeles-based architecture and interior design practice **Part Office**.

Activating the fair throughout the weekend will be curated, on-site **Special Projects**. The curatorial platform **Court Space**, which hosts exhibitions in L.A.'s public sports courts, will feature sculptural works by artist **Gozié Ojini**. A photographic installation by **Luciano Perna** will display selections from his archive of images of the Los Angeles art scene, taken in sittings and serendipitously, from the early 80's and on. These projects will highlight the social and athletic context of the fair at the Hollywood Athletic Club.
