First WOPHA Congress: *Women, Photography, and Feminisms* announces opening conversation

(MIAMI, November 3, 2021)—Women Photographers International Archive (WOPHA) announced today that it will open its first WOPHA Congress: Women, Photography, and Feminisms with a conversation between Aldeide Delgado, art researcher, curator, and founder and director of Women Photographers International Archive, and Andrea Nelson, associate curator, department of photographs, National Gallery of

Art that will be moderated by **Vanessa Rocco**, associate professor of humanities and fine art, Southern New Hampshire University.

The conversation, organized by the National Gallery of Art and WOPHA, will explore the divergent and common threads in each woman's professional chronicling of the innovative work of women photographers, and set the stage for a thought-provoking two-day convening of notable creative, critical and academic voices on the representation of women in photography.

As founder and director of WOPHA, Delgado advances recognition and research of underrepresented artists, specifically Latinx women, work which inspired Delgado to create the WOPHA Congress.

Nelson's current exhibition at the National Gallery of Art, <u>The New Woman Behind the Camera</u> was hailed as groundbreaking by critics when it opened this summer at the Metropolitan Museum of Art and continues to provoke dialogue about the global phenomenon of the modern New Woman and the groundbreaking impact of women photographers during the 1920s to the 1950s.

Rocco, co-editor of *The New Woman International* (2011) and author of *Photofascism: Photography, Film, and Exhibition Culture in 1930s Germany and Italy* (2020), will guide the conversation and draw parallels between the women photographers in the exhibition and those working today, reflecting on shifting definitions of new womanhood.

The WOPHA Congress, co-presented with the Pérez Art Museum Miami, will take place on November 18–19, 2021. It is the first two-day public convening of its kind, providing a platform to celebrate women and an unparalleled network for the international community of women in the photographic arts. Participation includes 50 internationally recognized artists, curators, scholars, and educators from around the world alongside 40 worldwide collectives and organizations of women and nonbinary photographers. The program, which is free and open to all, also includes events and exhibitions at various satellite locations in Miami.

The WOPHA Congress is made possible by co-presenters Women Photographers International Archive and Pérez Art Museum Miami (PAMM), with lead project support from the John S. and James L. Knight Foundation and official hotel partner, JW Marriott Marquis Miami.

<u>Women Photographers International Archive</u> (WOPHA) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization founded to research, promote, support, and educate, in partnership with other international organizations, on the role of those who identify as women and non-binary in photography. Having begun as a dynamic database showcasing the unique stories of women-identified Cuban photographers, WOPHA has expanded its geographic scope to include photographers around the globe. The organization is currently documenting the diverse artistic production of Latin American and Latinx communities, including photographers from Mexico, Central and South America, the Caribbean, and artists of Latin American descent living and working in the United States.

About Aldeide Delgado

Aldeide Delgado, a Cuban-born, Miami-based independent Latinx art historian and curator, is the founder & director of Women Photographers International Archive (WOPHA). Delgado studies, publishes on, and curates from feminist and decolonial perspectives on crucial topics of the history of photography and abstraction within Latin American, Caribbean, and Latinx contexts. Notably, she has lectured on the significance and subversive nature of international women photography collectives and marginalized identities in the arts at the Tate Modern, Pérez Art Museum Miami (PAMM), DePaul Art Museum, King's College London, California Institute of the Arts (CalArts), and The New School. Delgado is a recipient of a 2019 Knight Arts Challenge Award by the John S. and James L. Knight Foundation, the 2018 School of Art Criticism Fellowship by SAPS - La Tallera, and a 2017 Research and Production of Critic Essay Fellowship by TEOR/éTica. Prior to founding WOPHA, Delgado created the online feminist archive Catalog of Cuban Women Photographers, the first comprehensive survey of Cuban photography history highlighting women's contributions from the nineteenth century to the present. She is an active member of PAMM's International Women's Committee and PAMM's Latin American and Latinx Art Fund, US Latinx Art Forum, and the steering committee of the Feminist Art Coalition.

<u>Pérez Art Museum Miami</u> (PAMM), led by Director Franklin Sirmans, promotes artistic expression and the exchange of ideas, advancing public knowledge and appreciation of art, architecture and design, and reflecting the diverse community of its pivotal geographic location at the crossroads of the Americas.
